**Don't wait until the last minute! REAL ID Deadline Coming Up in 2025**



If you haven't yet gotten your REAL ID, the deadline is coming up on May 7, 2025. A REAL ID is needed to enter certain federal facilities, to board federally regulated commercial aircraft, and to enter nuclear power plants. 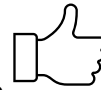

Key functions of a neighborhood association:

- **Raising awareness of local issues:**

Identifying problems like crime, infrastructure concerns, or environmental issues within the neighborhood.

- **Advocating for change:**

Communicating neighborhood concerns to local authorities and decision-makers to push for solutions.

- **Community building:**

Organizing social events like block parties, clean-ups, and neighborhood watch programs to foster connections between residents.

- **Maintaining property values:**

Working to preserve the aesthetic appeal and character of the neighborhood.

- **Providing information:**

Sharing updates on local developments and important information with residents.
